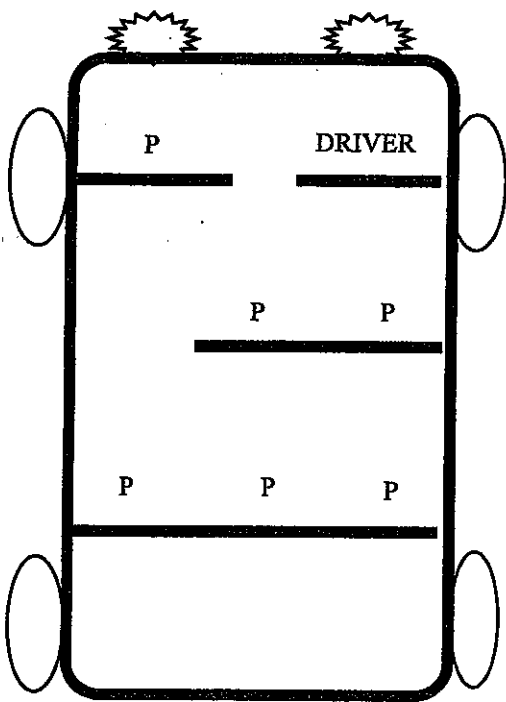


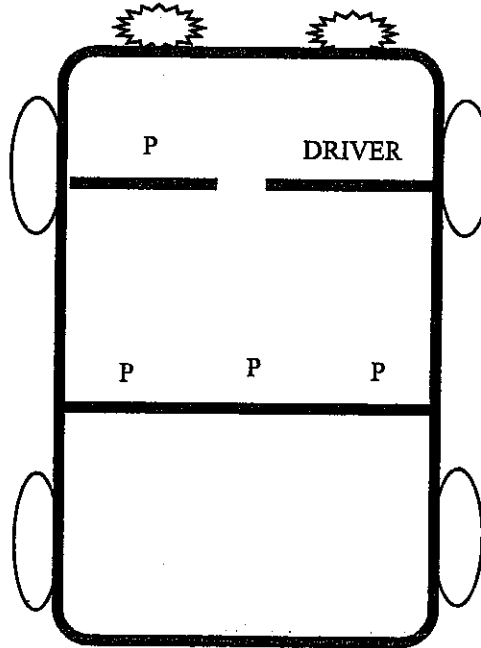
**ANCHOR POINT - CHILD RESTRAINT INSPECTION.**

Vehicles are required to have an anchor point inspection every 12 months under the National Quality Standard (Element 2.3.2 – Every reasonable precaution is taken to protect children from harm and any hazard likely to cause injury). Please refer to the scheme Transport Policy.

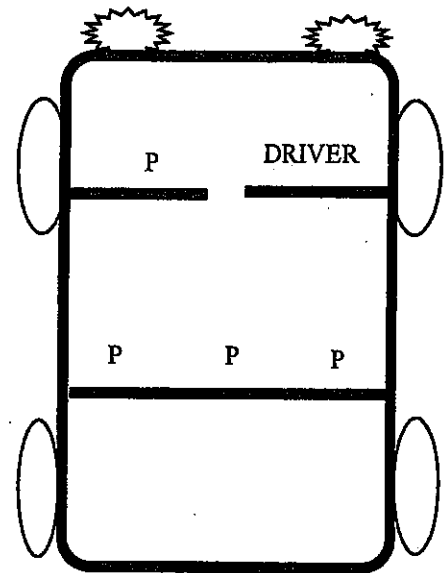
At your inspection the following should be checked: the anchor points you intend to use, age of the seats and condition of the seat belts. Child restraints have a recommended life span of 10 years and should be replaced after the expiry date or if they have been in an accident.
